Possible End of an Era

For more than 100 years, Waverly's three hydro turbines have been quietly generating electricity. In the beginning, they powered the whole city – which at that point mostly included streetlights.

It didn't take long before refrigeration became affordable and the power needs grew. Nowadays, the majority of Waverly's power comes from other sources, yet the turbines continue to spin. They've seen fires, floods and

radical changes to power needs as the community grew over the years.

"There aren't many companies out there still running equipment from the 1920's." Curt Atkins. Waverly Utilities' Director,

Operations, said. "While the historical element is fascinating, we're facing a decision on the hydro plant. Should we replace, rebuild or decommission?"

While the turbines do still function, their equipment is aging out. Getting parts



to repair them is an ongoing issue as they are no longer produced. The plant can only be operated manually, and

requires oversight when running. For the last two years, it has been off more than on. At its peak, the plant produced 2.5 million kWh (kilowatt hours) annually. Between the installation of the bladder dam and the ongoing low river levels, production has dropped to 500,000 kWh.

"Before we make any decisions, we need factual data," said Atkins. "We're currently working on arranging an engineering study to give us the overall perspective of the plant. Unfortunately, it's a challenge to even find a firm that works on plants like this. Our goal is to have data by the end of the year and present the options to the Board of Trustees."

- Most routers cover a 2,000 square foot home. Extenders are recommended for larger homes.

Whole Home WiFi is available for \$10.40 per month. All current customers will remain on the existing WiFi 5 service at no extra charge, while new customers have the option to utilize the Whole

Home service or provide their own equipment for WiFi at no fee. Current customers can upgrade to Whole Home WiFi for the monthly fee.

"We're launching this program with new customers to allow us time to master the learning curve on the new tech, as well as manage demand," said Magsamen. "We continue to face supply chain issues for some equipment. We're doing our best to be measured and cautious while still remaining progressive for our customers."

10G coming by 2026

Waverly Utilities is pleased to announce they will be ramping up internet speeds from 1G to 10G by 2026.

"Since the beginning of our telecommunications utility, the guiding principle has been to remain progressive," shared Jeff Magsamen, Telecom Director. "As technology evolves, it's our mission to stay ahead of the curve and provide the best possible service to our customers."

By 2026, Waverly Utilities' top internet speed will be 10G rather than the current 1G.

This is in direct response to the continued increase of internet devices per household. The current industry average is 15 devices per home and that number is projected to grow. As households continue to increase their internet-

connected devices, more bandwidth is needed.

"We're phasing into the 10G, which allows us to spread the costs out and manage it reasonably," said Magsamen. "It also allows us to continue to support the current tech without overwhelming our staff and customers."

Family & hobbies: My wife, Kris, is an instructor at Hawkeye Community College at the Adult Learning Center. We have two


kids – Karalynn who is a nurse, and Zach, who recently graduated from Wartburg.
