# BIDS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF FIBER-TO-THE-PREMISE DISTRIBUTION and DROP NETWORK in BREMER COUNTY, IA January 2023

#### 2.1 Description of the Project

The Project is generally described as follows:

Labor for Fiber to the Premise Feeder/Distribution and Drop Network Construction in Bremer County, IA. This project is supported by federal funds made available through the American Rescue Plan Act and the State of Iowa, acting by and through the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO).

#### 2.2 Description of the Work

The Work is generally described as follows:

**Bid Item 1:** Construction of Fiber-to-the-Premise Feeder/Distribution and Drop Network Project to areas in Bremer County This project is supported by federal funds made available through the American Rescue Plan Act and the State of Iowa, acting by and through the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO).

## 2.3 Scope of work

Contractor shall build the Network to 100% completion based on the design and engineering documents provided by the utility

The Contractor should provide all services outlined in the contract documents as well as normal and customary tasks related to a construction contract including but not limited to utilities coordination, staking, location of URD facilities, all permitting activities, preconstruction meetings, and the distribution of normal weekly updates and reports necessary to complete the feeder/distribution network to 100%.

The scope of this project includes construction of a fiber optic outside plant distribution network and testing services. Construction will include, but not be limited to, all ROW, man-holes, hand-holds, conduits, road, bridge and railway crossings, buildings, utility poles, traffic light structures, traffic control boxes, other utility structures, both existing and planned (new) that are pertinent to the construction of the fiber path and necessary to complete the project to 100%.

Cost submittal should include all costs relative to construction, and restoration activities.

# 2.4 Material Breakdown

The design should provide all data related to the breakdown labor units for construction. This list should provide unit information for all labor as listed below. Any deviation in these unit items will be reviewed by

Waverly Communications Utility Telecom Director prior to awarding of the Contract. Maps and Material sheets are included.

Waverly Communications Utility will purchase the fiber optic cable, conduit, trace wire, pedestals, vaults, closures, splitter cabinets, signage etc. Essentially, the contractor will provide labor for installation services for the project. Waverly Communications Utility has placed the orders for material and delivery is estimated in May of 2023. A delay in the commencement date could occur depending on material availability.

# 2.5 Reponses to Scope of Work

Each potential Contractor shall submit a plan describing its approach to the project described in this Bid. The plan shall describe the Contractor's approach to the construction of the Network in sufficient detail to allow Waverly Communications Utility to effectively consider the bid. The Contractor shall also include a description of the day-to-day operations and the management of all responsibilities related to this project and explains how the Contractor will fulfill the scope of work in Section 2.2. This should include, at a minimum, the following:

- Rollout strategy: A discussion of the anticipated construction strategy, scope, and timing of the proposed schedule. The Contractor should also include a discussion of any factors likely to influence the scope or timing of the construction schedule and explain how those factors impact the timeline.
- Roles and responsibilities: A description of the roles and responsibilities envisioned for Contractor, Contractor's team members (if any), Waverly Communications Utility, and third parties (if applicable) for each of the following:
  - Network construction
  - Network fiber testing
  - Network certification

# 2.6 Contractor's Representation

In submitting this bid, Contractor represents that:

A. Contractor has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents and the other related data identified in the Bidding Documents and the following Addenda, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged: (list Addenda by Addenda Number and Date)

- B. Contractor has visited the Site and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local and site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- C. Contractor is familiar with and is satisfied as to all federal, state, and local Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of work.

- D. Contractor has considered the information known to Contractor; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Contract Documents; and Site-related reports and drawings identified in the Contract Documents, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and documents on (1) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (2) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Contractor, including any specific means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction expressly required by the Contract Documents; and (3) Contractor's safety precautions and programs.
- E. Based on the information and observations referred to in Paragraphs above, Contractor does not consider that any further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, with the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.
- F. Contractor is aware of the general nature of the work to be performed by Waverly Communications Utility and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.
- G. Contractor has given Waverly Communications Utility written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Contractor has discovered in the Contract Documents, and is acceptable to the Contractor.
- H. The Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
- I. Contractor will submit written evidence of its authority to do business in the state of Iowa not later than the date of its execution of the Agreement.

# 2.7 Contractor's Certificates

Contractor certifies that:

- A. This bid is genuine and not made in the interest of or on behalf of any undisclosed individual or entity and is not submitted in conformity with any collusive agreement or rules of any group, association, organization or corporation;
- B. Contractor has not directly or indirectly induced or solicited any other Contractor to submit a false or sham bid;
- C. Contractor has not solicited or induced any individual or entity to refrain from bidding; and
- D. Contractor has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for or in executing the Contract. For the purposes of the Paragraph:
  - a. "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process or in the Contract execution;
  - b. "fraudulent practice" means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process or the execution of the Contract to the detriment of Waverly Communications Utility, (b) to establish Bid or Contract prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Waverly Communications Utility of the benefits of free and open competition;
  - c. "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more contractors, with or without the knowledge of Waverly Communications Utility, a purpose of which is to establish Bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels; and

d. "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the bidding process or affect the execution of the Contract.

## 2.8 Contractor's Acknowledgements

The undersigned Contractor proposes and agrees, if this bid is accepted, to enter into an Agreement with Waverly Communications Utility in the form included in the bidding documents to perform all Work as specified or indicated in the bidding documents for the prices and within the times indicated in this bid and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the bidding documents.

Contractor accepts all of the terms and conditions of the Advertisement or Invitation to bid and Instruction to Contractors, including without limitation those dealing with the disposition of bid security. This bid will remain subject to acceptance for thirty days after the bid opening, or for such longer period of time that Contractor may agree to in writing upon request of Waverly Communications Utility. Contractor will sign and deliver the required number of counterparts of the Agreement with the Bonds and other documents required by the bidding requirements within fifteen days after the date of Waverly Communications Utility Notice of Award.

Bidder will complete the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents for the following prices:

The detail spreadsheet provided below in the bid documents must be filled out for unit prices.

Items 1 thru 9 are conduit and fiber handling charges for right of way installations and are based on linear foot

Items 10 thru 16 are per unit items. Vault Installation will require 2 inches of gravel under the base. Gravel will be provided by the contractor.
